

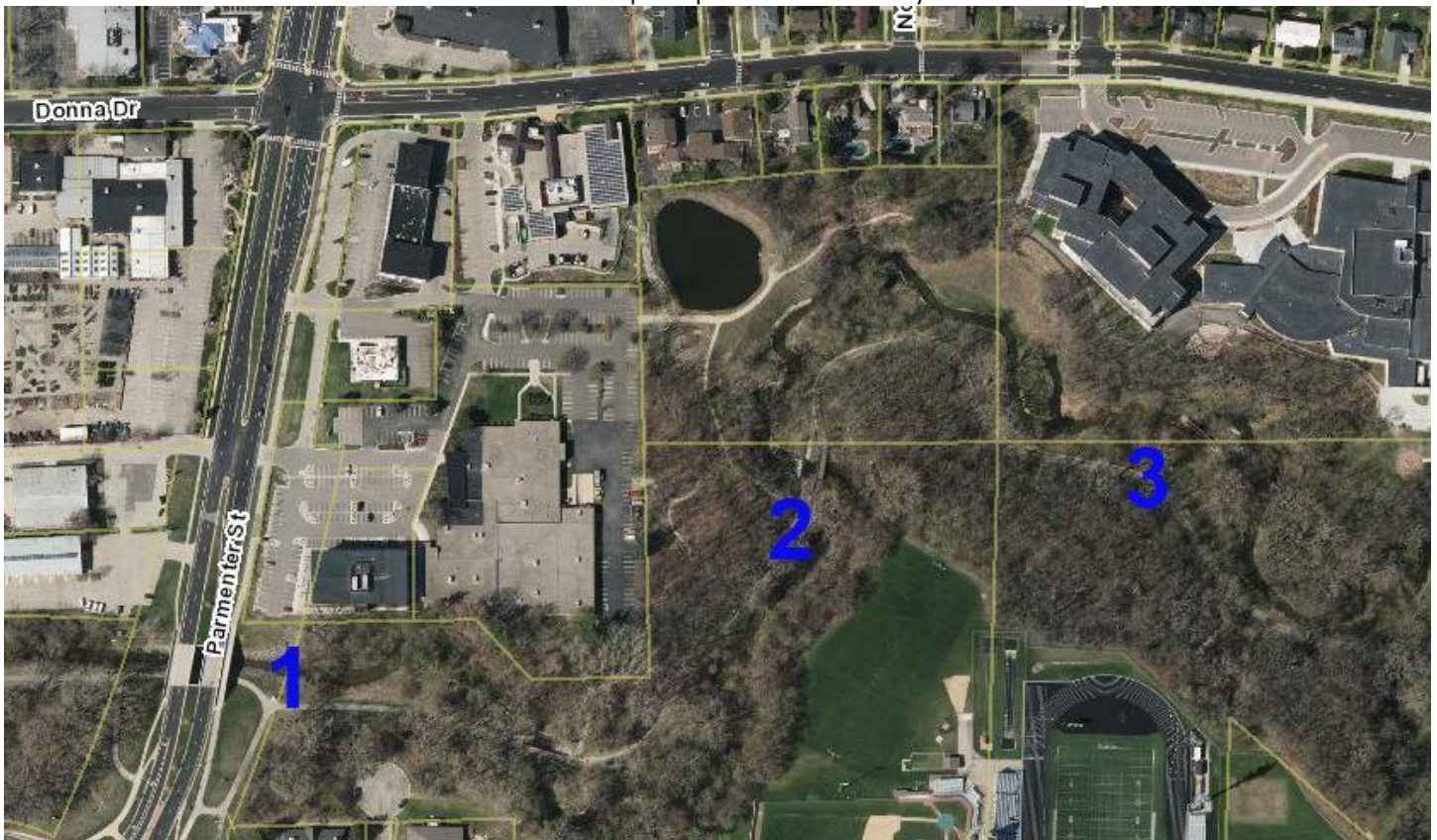


## National Trails Day 2019

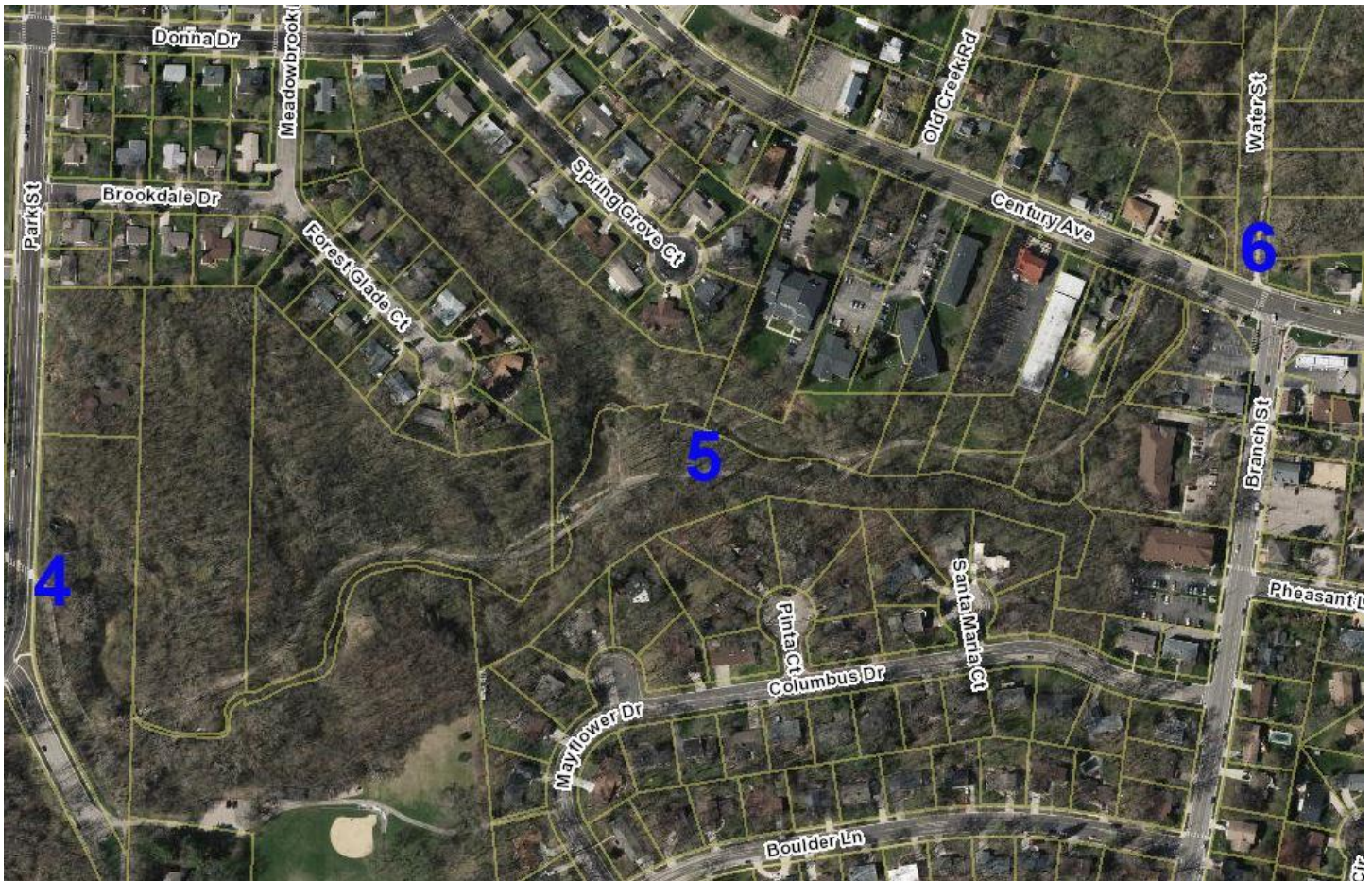
