VIP Security

A very important person (VIP) is a dignitary, famous person, notorious person, or any other person in need of special security. Occasionally this agency may need to provide or assist in providing security for VIP's. Prior to the arrival of any VIP, the Chief of Police will designate an agency member to supervise and coordinate VIP security. The designated member will:

- A. Ensure that appropriate equipment such as vehicles, body armor, weapons, observation equipment, and communication equipment is available.
- B. Plan and reconnoiter travel routes and alternate routes.
- C. Conduct advance inspections of sites and facilities.
- D. Gather appropriate intelligence information with the cooperation of outside agencies.
- E. Coordinate all aspects of VIP operations within this agency and outside agencies (Secret Service, U.S. Marshall, FBI, State Patrol, Dane County Sheriff's Department, other local agencies on the VIP route).
- F. Obtain emergency medical information (blood type, drug allergies, etc.), assignment of EMT's, and which medical facilities to be used at various points of the VIP presence.
- G. Ensure communication capabilities among all involved agencies.
- H. Coordinate methods of identification for all participating agencies.
